



## Delton Dean Dunford

November 2, 1943 - March 14, 2025

Delton Dean Dunford, age 81, a retired business owner, mechanic, and jack-of-all-trades, died Friday, March 14, 2025, at his home in Pittsburg, KS. For the past year, he had bravely fought pancreatic cancer. He lived most of his adult life in Pittsburg, KS. He was born to Delwin and Mildred Dunford on November 2, 1943, in Pierre, South Dakota. He graduated from La Sierra Academy in Riversdale, California, in 1961. He was married to Joy Dunford; they later divorced.
