He carried that through his life, smiling at everyone because his smile could bring sunshine to any rainy day. He was also an amateur comedian, using his smile and eyebrows for special effects. He had a sense of humor that was all across the board. This man could make anything and everything funny. He could knock the air out of you with his jokes, and then make you suck in air just so you can laugh some more.

Dennis was loved and accepted everywhere he went. This man had a passion for life like it was a fresh peach and he squeezed it so tight as to get every last drop. He possessed extraordinary tenacity and a love for life so strong that even in the darkest hours of the hardest times he could rise above it to find peace. No matter what happened or how hard it hit him, he would get up and go again. This man had such a way, that even in gruff emotional conflict when he sensed resolution, he would dive right in for the forward motion. Dennis Wayne Souza Sr was born 07/02/1951 at 2:53 a.m. in Honolulu, Hawaii on the island of O'ahu. As the first-born grandchild to both the Souza and Torres lineages, he was well received by both lines and adored by the whole family. His family moved to San Bruno, California where he flourished from the age of 5 to adulthood. His first job lasted years as a paperboy in San Bruno, CA. As a teenager, he worked at the Dole Pineapple factory in Hawaii and at a Phillips 66 in Moss Beach, CA where he fixed tires, pumped gas, and washed car windows. Dennis was a letterman and graduate of Oceania High School, class of 1969, in Sharp Park, CA, and he attended the College of San Mateo in San Bruno, CA. He played baseball as an adult on the Hawaiian Islanders of San Mateo County, CA. Wanting a family of his own, he married Cheryl Kim Dodge (now Henning) in August 1972, sharing two children together. In 1982, he further extended his family with Robyn Lynn, sharing one child together. Dennis married Melody Lake in December 1988, and they have two children together. Dennis and Melody remained happily married for the rest of his life, loving a combined eight children together. He joined the United Brotherhood of Carpenters in 1972. He vested in three states, CA, MI, and MO, at 32 years vested and retired out in 2004. Upon retirement, Dennis and

Melody bought a farm and raised goats as a hobby.

Dennis passed peacefully at Girard Medical Center in Girard, KS at the age of 70 due to an arterial aneurysm. Some say it was a "good death," because the event was attended by his wife Melody and his youngest son Dennis Jr. He is sorely missed by many and will forever be in our hearts.

My dad was a high school teacher/coach and the only way to get out of the house on weekends was if you were going to play a sport. We also delivered newspapers together. We would hide and jump out to scare one another and we had some great water balloon fights during our delivery routes.

Mr Souza helped me as well. He taught Dennis and I to box in the front yard and how to work on cars. He even tried to get us interested in raising and caring for carrier pigeons (without luck).

Dennis and I lost contact over the years without the availability of cell phones or the internet back then. Last year I was able to reach him on his wife's cell phone using my wife's cell phone, since neither of us had our own phones. We were both reminiscing and laughing the entire call and I was smiling as always just talking to him. Dennis, we will miss you.
