Robert “Bob” Lavern Moore, 78, passed away on October 20, 2024, at his home in Girard, Kansas after a lengthy battle with cancer. He was born on March 27, 1946, in Oakland, California, to Lester and Velma (James) Moore. He attended McCluer High School in Florissant, Missouri, graduating in 1964. Later that year, he and his family moved to Southern California, where he worked for Northrop, and eventually established a career in law enforcement, completing the Los Angeles Police Academy and then serving on the Los Angeles Police Department from 1969-1984. He then worked for Riverside County Courts until his retirement in 1997. In 1999, he relocated his family to southeast Kansas where he had spent several years of his childhood and had other distant relatives. Once settled in Kansas, he enjoyed the time he spent as the Chief of Police in Arcadia.

He was a parishioner at St. Michael’s Catholic Church in Girard and a member of the Knights of Columbus. He enjoyed spending time with his family, reminiscing about his childhood, fishing, tinkering around his garage, watching western films, listening to Elvis, sipping a cup of coffee as he read the news, visiting antique shops, was an avid reader, loved history and visiting historical sites, especially Civil War battlefield sites.

He celebrated the accomplishments of his children and grandchildren and was eager to cheer them on in their respective activities, attending countless athletic games, band concerts, piano recitals, sacraments, and high school and college graduation ceremonies. He was exceedingly proud of his son,
